“ When we were young, Billy was almost always working with his dad and brothers...peeling poles and cutting posts. Then on Saturday night, we'd go to the movies.... (hitchhiking most of the time to Talihina and back! If we were lucky, we could catch a ride with Mr. Kelley and his wife)! Before we got old enough for our guns, we'd hunt squirrels and birds with home made pea shooters or bows and arrows. We'd hunt rabbits in Mr. Phillips' field. Saturday was always squirrel hunting day, and after we got the squirrels cleaned, we'd always eat about 2 each of my mom's chocolate pies. If we weren't working, we'd always be out hunting or fishing. Sometimes we would get on Billy's black horse, and we'd ride up under that pear tree at Muse, (Mr Saunders' tree!) Mr. Saunders would be dozing on his porch. Billy would be on the front of the horse, and I'd be on the back. Then I'd kinda stretch up and grab a limb and shake us off a few pears... they were good sweet pears! That would wake Mr. Saunder's up, and he'd yell at us to go away! One time Billy took off so fast I nearly slid off...my arms were so full of pears! One day I was in the Post Office, and someone asked Mr. Saunders if he had a lot of pears on his tree. Mr Saunders nodded. Then they asked, "What are you gonna do with all those pears?", and he said he'd can a few...then he grinned and looked over at me and said, "If I can keep those boys out of them"! Billy always was kind and generous....he would bring you a mess of fish ...if you didn't mind cleaning 'em! If he found wild grapes, he'd bring you a bag full. We had so many fun days....it was great having a cousin like Billy!
