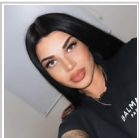

Of course I immediately ended up on the ground, right under the horse. Some horses would have kicked or stomped, but John's horse just stood there. John just smiled.

Once we were visiting and Mom and Dad's little dog was with us. The dog got very sick and it was the weekend and no way to get to a vet. John had some cow or horse medication, and somehow figured out exactly how to downsize the dose; he gave the dog a shot and she survived. After we got back home Mom took her to a vet, who verified she would have died without John's intervention.
