Some of her longest friendships have developed thru her puppy relationships. She was so proud of the quality and disposition of her puppies, relishing in the fact that several families have purchased 3, 4 even 5 dogs from her over the years. “*Marsha was my neighbor for 9 years. We became good friends with her and her husband Steve. We were very sad when they left Weatherford to retire to NE Oklahoma, we missed many opportunities to hang out and spend time with them, we all had busy lives. I had just talked to Steve on May 21 via text messages and he didn't mention any issues with Marsha, it seems all this news happened shortly after that conversation. We were truly shocked to get the news that Marsha had passed.*

Marsha was a wonderful person and neighbor, she would help us in any way at any time. We enjoyed just sitting and talking with her, she was always matter of fact, but very friendly. She never tried to be someone who she wasn't, she was a genuine straight shooter. She didn't live in the past, she had an attitude of bad things happen, and we can dwell on them and let them ruin our day, or we can put them behind us and enjoy the day God has given us, Marsha was the latter. Although if something was a constant reminder of her past, she wanted nothing to do with it. I found this out when I was wearing overalls, she didn't like them and I remember joking around telling her I was going to get some for Steve for his birthday. She seemed to indicate she wouldn't be wearing them so it was a waste of money.

Most of all, Marsha really did love her ranch life. She enjoyed her animals more than most. They were family to her, from horses to goats, dogs and cats, and even her beloved chickens (her girls) she would call them. She made sure they were well cared for and loved. They lived like royalty (for farm animals). We even inherited 15 of her chickens when they left, and ironically, when Marsha passed we still had one of them. But just 2 days ago, that girl also left us, coincidence? Not sure, but we were sad all over again.

When it came to her horses, I could tell she was very comfortable around those large animals, they can be intimidating, but Marsha was having none of it, I think they were intimidated by her, lol.

She was also a strong and tough woman when needed, I remember one day, seeing her in the back field, near the fence with a horse. I didn't think anything of it, she wasn't there a very long time (although it probably felt very long for her). Apparently, one of their horses impaled itself through the front shoulder on a T-post and was stuck to the T-post. She somehow managed to help it free itself and then loaded the horse and headed to the vet to get it cared for. I don't know if I could have done the same, but she saved that horse that day.

Marsha you were good to us, we will miss you. We never did get to take a trip together (which we talked over a number of times), or even visit your new place while you were still with us. Somehow life got away from us. We are sorry for what you had to go through, we will always remember you as a good neighbor and true friend.
